However, a small number of extremist groups and individuals are spreading hate, lies and fear within our communities. They want nothing more than to exploit the struggles that communities face, attempting to turn people against each other.

Despite being few in number, they seem stronger than they really are. Why? Because digital platforms enable them to freely orchestrate their campaign of disruption by providing them with a giant megaphone to spread their hate and lies.

Death threats, incitement to violence, dehumanising language, hate speech and disinformation have been reported repeatedly to sodal media platforms. The consistent response is that this content compiles with their 'community standards'.
